## Recipes

### **Sussex Fruit Tea Loaf**

Soak overnight in 300ml cold tea:- 230g mixed fruit 60g whole cherries

Next day:- to the mixture add:-  
230g self raising Flour 1 rounded tsp Golden Syrup  
175g soft brown sugar 1 beaten egg, medium size  
2 level tsp mixed spice

Pre-heat oven to 180°C, gas 4, Grease and line a 2lb loaf tin. Mix well and pour into the prepared tin, level top and bake approx one hour, or, until skewer comes out clean. Turn out of tin when baked and peel off paper lining. Loaf improves by keeping, serve sliced with butter.

### **Classic Victoria Sponge**

2 large eggs	self raising flour
caster sugar	unsalted butter or margarine
vanilla essence	

Weigh the eggs and then use the weight for equal amounts of sugar and butter (margarine). Prepare using the creamed method. Prepare 2 lined and greased 7" tins. Bake in pre-heated oven at 180°F, for 20—25 minutes. When cool, sandwich together with raspberry jam and dust lightly with icing sugar.

**Rules**

1. Entries must be put in the box at the Rogate Stores no later than 4pm on Thursday 4th August 2011. Entries will not be accepted after this date.
2. Classes 1-100, Entry Fee. 35p for each entry. Childrens Classes 101 -114, Entry Fee. 50p irrespective of the number of entries. Children must write their age on the entry form in the space provided.
3. The Marquee will be open for staging exhibits from 8am - 10 am.
4. Please do not use the exhibit tables to assemble your exhibit, there will be a separate table for this.
5. Gummed labels bearing class number and exhibitor's unique identification will be supplied and must be affixed to **all exhibits**. For jars place ½” from bottom of jar, Fix on plates, vases and other exhibits where practicable.  
**No other labelling will be permitted.**  
**Labels will be available on Saturday morning, but will be posted earlier on receipt of a S.A.E with Entry Forms submitted before 1st August.**
6. No person may make more than one entry in a single class.
7. The Marquee will be cleared at 10 am. Judging 10.15 - 12.15pm.
8. The judges have the power to disqualify an entry if it is not according to the schedule. The judges have the power to withdraw awards where there are insufficient entries.
9. Any exhibits shown in previous shows will be disqualified.
10. The Judges decision is final.

The committee regret they are unable to accept responsibility for loss or damage to the exhibits although every care will be taken.

All cups for the competition are perpetual challenge trophies and remain the property of the Village Hall Committee.

2. 5 radishes [in a bunch]
3. 5 dwarf Beans

6. 5 shallots [large] – tops tied
7. 5 pickling shallots- tops tied- not more than 30mm diameter
8. 3 onions - tops trimmed, tied or whipped - under 250g each
9. 3 onions - tops trimmed, tied or whipped - over 250g each
10. 6 spring onions – tied in a bunch with roots
11. 3 tomatoes – red or yellow
12. 5 small fruited tomatoes
13. 3 potatoes [one variety white]
14. 3 potatoes [one variety coloured]
15. 3 courgettes [maximum 6 inches in length]
16. 3 carrots – long pointed any variety [trimmed tops]
17. 3 carrots other than above [trimmed tops]
18. 3 round beetroot [trimmed 2"above the crown]
19. 1 frame cucumber
20. 1 ridge cucumber
21. 2 marrows – table size- approx: 12 inches long
22. 2 lettuce – (a matching pair) any variety
23. 9 raspberries – with stalks [on 7inch plate]
24. collection of 5 different varieties of herbs in water
