What's Been Happening

Midhurst, Easebourne and Lodsworth.

Throughout the last month we have conducted licensing checks in the local off licences in Midhurst and Easebourne. Police cadets have been used in the stores to attempt to purchase alcohol and we are pleased to report that all of the stores tested passed with no underage purchasing occurring.

We held a Day of action in June Meadows with communal areas being tidied and improved.

Two incidents have occurred at a local public house, one being an assault for which a male was arrested and positively dealt with. The second incident was on New Years Eve, where a fight between two groups resulted in the arrest of two males.

As far as antisocial behaviour goes the number of incidents reported to the Police has dropped considerably.

Midhurst Rural Area.

It is pleasing to note that the number of rural thefts has fallen markedly over the past few months. Arrests have been made in this area with four persons being taken into custody and a large amount of garden furniture and horse tack recovered. (See www.sussex.police.uk/farmline for details).

Two males were also arrested and charged with burglary after an alert neighbour noticed suspicious males on a property in West Harting.

After reports of a male driving underage in the Fernhurst area a vehicle was seized with enquiries ongoing.

Reports of antisocial behaviour have diminished which may in part be due to the inclement weather over the holiday periods, however, this may also be due to increased police patrolling and youth engagement.

A Day of Action was held in Rogate with communal areas being tidied and generally improved.

Operation CASTLE, the placing of police 'bait' equipment has resulted in the arrest of two persons, from out of the area, for theft.

Thefts from farm/rural building are still occurring with diesel thefts on the increase: a full tank of diesel is a valuable commodity and hence needs to be stored as securely as possible.

Thefts from vehicles at beauty spot car parks are still occurring with members of the public continuing to leave valuables in their vehicles. DO NOT leave valuables in your vehicle?

A joint force initiative to combat rural crime including Sussex, Surrey and Hampshire Police is ongoing. This has up to now produced positive results including recovery of property the arrest of offenders.

Petworth and surrounding area.

In the last month we have spent a number of days targeting motorists driving through the Town. No lorries were seen driving through the 'No HGV' restriction on either occasion.

There was a break to a antique shop in the town and working with Surry Police we have recovered all items stolen and have three people in custody.

A digger stolen from London was recovered near Bury thanks to it having a tracking device fitted. Sussex Police also discovered a number of other stolen items resulting in three people being arrested and ongoing enquiries.

Two houses were broken into in Plaistow and Wisborough Green. Two males later arrested in West Harting for a similar offence were thought to be responsible.

Christmas and the New Year period went well with very few reported incidents of anti social behaviour but there were a number of arrests for drink driving.
